



Fr. Gregg was born in Tarlac City on October 31, 1953. He studied at Holy Spirit College and Don Bosco Institute in Tarlac. After graduating from elementary, he entered the seminary of the Congregation of the Mission. In 1975, he graduated from Adamson University with a bachelor's degree in Philosophy. He continued his studies in Theology at UST finishing in 1979. In March of that year he was ordained a priest.

The first years of his priesthood were spent giving popular missions. After which, he was sent to the St. Vincent School of Theology in Quezon City to become the Director of Students and professor of pastoral theology.

Fr. Gregg was also involved with an international non-governmental organization called the Movement for a Better World. He became the East Asian coordinator of this group for six years and facilitated training programs in Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Burma, Japan, and Korea.

In August of 1992, he was sent to the United States to continue his graduate studies. He started his master's degree in Organizational Development at Loyola University, Chicago, Illinois in 1993. In January of 2000, he obtained his Ph.D. in Organizational Behavior at the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio.

In 2000, he was elected as the Vice President for Student Affairs in Adamson University and from 2001-2002, he was the Vice President for Administration.

Fr. Gregg is the primary fundraising officer of the University, having some experiences in it since his early days as a priest.
